

Completion of the infrastructure diagnostics of the Insula power plant, which will allow us to advance in the formulation stage of intervention alternatives to extend its useful life for 30 years.

- Start of operation of the substations Nueva Colonia in Urabá, El Limón in Santo Domingo, and Yondó in Yondó, contributing to the strengthening of the energy infrastructure.
- We implemented the Santa Rosa digital substation, in phase 2, which allows signal communication through fiber optics, reducing conventional wiring, reducing civil infrastructure, and entering the digital model in the business.
- We completed a pilot of D-FACTS technology that allows us to avoid or postpone the construction of new power distribution lines or the repowering of existing ones.



Climate change

 - **100% self-supply of electricity at the Aguas Claras WWTP** using, among others, energy sources such as biogas generated from sludge digestion.
- First phase of the project that will take biogas from the San Fernando WWTP, to add it and inject it as renewable natural gas into our grid.







- Panels for energy self-supply in the EPM Building and other administrative offices of the Group: Ensa, Delsur and CHEC.
- 2.14 MWp installed in self-generation solutions for non-residential customers with high energy consumption.
