



Informative Advance No.127

In reaction to the information published by the media citing a class action by the National Attorney General's Office against EPM and other entities for the Ituango Hydroelectric Project, EPM wishes to clarify that:

- 1. To date, EPM has not been notified of or officially received a class action from the National Attorney General's Office against it, which according to some national media was brought before the Cundinamarca Administrative Court.
- 2. In reaction to the headlines on this alleged class action by the National Attorney General's Office, which indicate that EPM has not delivered truthful and reliable information, the company reiterates that it has not concealed information about the contingency in the Ituango hydroelectric project and moreover that it has not lied about its dimensions. From the time the contingency was presented, the organization has informed public opinion in an opportune and truthful manner in both the influence zones and on local and national levels using different media and communication platforms in accordance with the development of the facts. In turn, it has transparently provided all the information requested by the different inspection bodies in terms of time and depth.
- 3. EPM has spared no efforts and resources in addressing the contingency in the Ituango hydroelectric project, always with the following in order of priority: the protection of the community, care for the environment and the recovery of the project. The company has always been and always will be on the community's side, because its service vocation is to work day-by-day to contribute to its quality of life and well-being. EPM is not against the people, and as a result it works tirelessly with its officials to normalize the situation downstream of the future power generation plant.
- 4. EPM will continue collaborating with the authorities in the clarification of what happened in the Ituango hydroelectric project, resolving any doubts that arise and expanding on any understanding.
