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On June 14, EPM gave a formal response to the observations made by the Republic's General Controller's Office regarding the Exceptional Control that it carried out on the Ituango Hydroelectric Project.

In its response the company indicated that it has worked for the adequate and proper acquisition, planning, retention, administration, custody, consumption, expense, and disposition of the resources assigned to the execution of the Project, for the purpose of fulfilling the essential purposes of the State, subject to the principles of legality, efficiency, economy, effectiveness, equity, fairness, morality, transparency, publicity and valuation of environmental costs.

In the document, the organization presented the various factors that despite planning may influence the development of a vast construction project such as the Ituango hydroelectric project as well as the risk analyses performed based on guidelines standardized in the world.

On the stability of the works, the entity noted, among other things, that the rock mass is stable and under constant monitoring and that inspection and repair work has been continuous, respecting the security and modification requirements to access the different work fronts.

EPM responded to observations from the Republic's General Controller's Office ranging from the start of building the future power generation center that is currently under the care of the contingency.
