John Maya Salazar assumed his position as CEO of EPM and leader of the EPM Group.

The engineer from Antioquia, John Maya Salazar, was sworn in this Monday, January 1, 2024, as CEO of EPM, a position in which he will lead the EPM Group for the four-year period from 2024-2027. He is replacing engineer Jorge Andrés Carrillo Cardoso.
