

RELEVANT INFORMATION
Amendment to the Arbitration Claim - Ituango Hydroelectric Project
EPM is pleased to inform the public that:

In follow-up to the relevant information report disclosed on June 24, 2025, concerning the arbitration claim initiated by Sociedad Hidroeléctrica Ituango S.A. E.S.P. (HI), EPM hereby reports on the amendment submitted to said claim.

1. On June 24, 2025, EPM responded to the arbitration claim filed by HI before the Center for Conciliation, Arbitration, and Amicable Composition of the Medellín Chamber of Commerce, identified under case number 2024 A 00033. In addition, EPM filed a counterclaim within the same proceeding.
2. The initial claim seeks, among other requests, a declaration of EPM's breach of the BOOMT Contract, primarily related to the alleged failure to meet Milestone 10 concerning the commencement of commercial operations for generation unit 8, and an order for EPM to pay the remuneration and enforcement penalty clauses, initially estimated at a total of COP 2,492,307,510,639.
3. On July 29, 2025, EPM was notified of the amendment to the claim submitted by HI. This amendment includes modifications to the facts and requests outlined in the claim. The economic demands have increased substantially, rising from COP **2,492,307,510,639** to COP **7,522,876,216,000**, representing an approximate increase of COP **5,030,568,706,286**. This increase is primarily attributable to the updating of certain claimed amounts and the assertion of new penalty clauses by HI.
4. EPM will respond to the amended claim within the legally prescribed timeframe (no later than August 22, 2025), supported by robust technical, legal, and financial arguments that align with the defense strategy established for the arbitration proceeding.
5. Nevertheless, HI and EPM remain committed to jointly exploring the potential for an agreement that would enable a final resolution of the legal and economic disputes or litigation arising from the BOOMT Contract, subject to adherence to legal procedures and the rulings of the Arbitral Tribunal.
6. Through these actions, the intent to safeguard the interests and rights of EPM, HI, and all other stakeholders is reaffirmed, with a focus on ensuring the ongoing progress and successful completion of the Ituango Hydroelectric Project in accordance with the objectives set forth in the BOOMT Contract and in the broader interest of the country.
